Town Centre West: Coming Soon



We are really proud to see St Andrews Park gaining momentum as a vibrant new neighbourhood. The next phase we are bringing forward will be Town Centre West. The principle of development of this quarter was agreed nine years ago. Following this in 2016 we submitted detailed designs for Hillingdon council to consider. With several years now having passed, the council is reconsulting local residents on the designs.

Town Centre West will be a vibrant new part of St Andrews Park comprising 294 flats (57 of which will be affordable). Alongside the new homes there will be parking provision as well as space for new shops. Exactly what the shops will be is still to be decided but they could include a café, yoga studio or even a small foodstore. The homes and shops at Town Centre West will be set within beautifully landscaped surroundings – including part of a landscaped route we are planning to connect St. Andrew's Park with the Uxbridge town centre.

Road safety audit update



There have been a number of concerns raised by residents about general road safety at St. Andrews Park.

We have therefore recently completed a Stage 3 Road Safety Audit across St Andrew's Road and Churchill Road (including the junctions onto Hillingdon Road) and are now working with our Highways Designers and London Borough of Hillingdon to agree some key improvement works to ensure

improved pedestrian and vehicle safety across the site.

We know this is important to the community and will be in touch with detail of the works once they are agreed with London Borough of Hillingdon.

We hope to be implementing the first stage of these works over the summer, subject to approvals.

Bulky waste collection service



Large waste items can be collected from outside your property for a small charge of £25 using our bulky waste collections service. For residents aged over 65 and those in receipt of Personal Independence Payment, the service is free. Residents can book a collection every 3 months. Landlords can book collections as and when needed. One collection can consist of either:

• A fridge or freezer (with no other items added) or up to 6 items, which can include mattresses and wardrobes (but not fridges or freezers) - in place of 1 bulky item, we can accept 3 black bags of unwanted smaller items, such as broken toys

• We will make collections Monday to Friday, starting at 7am. Please ensure all your items are ready for collection before this time.

• Book a bulky waste collection by calling 01895 556000 (Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm).

•If you have any bulky items that we cannot accept, why not try LoveJunk? It's an online marketplace that matches you to nearby licensed and insured waste carriers who collect bulky waste, furniture and appliances.

Estate agent boards

Under the terms of your lease no advertisements or hoardings, including estate agent boards are to be erected on the property. Any estate agents boards will be automatically removed if seen on site.



Dry mixed recycling

In Hillingdon, you can recycle paper, cardboard, glass and plastics every week for free and it all goes in the same clear recycling bag.

Items accepted through this service

- Aerosol cans
- Aluminium foil, including clean foil trays and containers
 Books
- •Butter and margarine tubs

•Cardboard and paper, including printing paper, newspapers, catalogues, envelopes, magazines, junk mail, greeting cards and wrapping paper shredded paper

- •Cartons made from paper and cardboard
- •Drink cans and food tins
- •Egg boxes made from cardboard
- •Glass bottles and jars
- •Metal bottle tops and jar lids

•Plastics, including bottles, trays, bottle tops, triggers from household cleaners, shampoo bottles, shower gel bottles
